LESSON OBJECTIVE

After completing this lesson, the children will understand that it is important for us to obey God.

AS KIDS ARRIVE (10 minutes)

BIBLE VERSE (7 minutes)

"Noah walked with God." Genesis 6:9b

Explain to the children that Noah loved and obeyed God even when no one else would.

BIBLE STORY (15 minutes)

Read the following story, but be sure to inform the children that they can have their parents read the story of Noah's Ark to them right out of the Bible.

Listen carefully as I read a story to you, about Noah, his family and the Ark. When I'm done I will ask you some very interesting questions.

~~Read Genesis 6:9-14 or read the story Noah and All The Animals~~

Discussion Questions:

1. In our story today who was following God? (Noah)
2. What did God tell Noah to build? (An Ark)
3. What is an Ark? (A boat that was very big)
4. Why did God tell Noah to build the Ark? (God was going to cause a flood of water to cover the earth)

Noah's Mixed Up Animals

Materials:

A wide variety of medium sized plastic toy animals, two of each.
(Should be large enough so as not to pose a choking hazard)

Topics:

Animals, Caring, Noah

A box large enough to hold all the animals. The box should be decorated to look like the Ark.

Duration:

Approximately 15 minutes

Target Age:

Preschool to Grade 1

What you will do:

Start by telling the story of Noah's Ark, how God gave Noah the job of collecting two of each kind of animal. Tell the kids that you have a fun game for them. Say, "Somehow all the animals got mixed together. Your job is to find the animal pairs and put them back into the Ark."

At this point, dump the variety of animals out on the floor or tabletop and have the kids find the matches. Once the kids have finished ask them if they think Noah's job would have been hard or easy. Would it have been fun to take care of all the animals? What would be the hardest thing to do? What would be the easiest?
